<p>My child's whole bubble is not permitted to attend school because they, or another member of their bubble, have tested positive for Covid-19.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>We enter another 'lockdown' with total school closure.</p>	<p>Children will be able to access their remote education via Seesaw – a learning journey platform. Different areas of the curriculum will be planned for children to access daily. Activities and tasks will be designed to be completed in the home or garden. These activities will now be directly linked to what would have been taught in school at that time and will make specific reference to new teaching content as well as consolidating previous learning too.</p> <p>Remote education will be shared on the Seesaw platform in a variety of ways – sometimes through PDF documents, images, and videos explaining concepts, teacher audio recordings and links to other websites. Children can respond to the tasks set on paper and then take a photo to upload to Seesaw or they can draw, type or record audio straight onto the platform.</p>

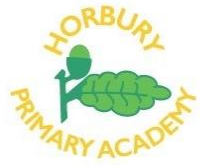

The rest of their school bubble are attending school and being taught as normal.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children will be provided with a Home Learning pack to take home. • This will include: • Log in details for TTRockstars • Log in for Purple Mash • Grammar Activities • Arithmetic work • Curriculum tasks e.g. research tasks based on the current topic
<p>My child's whole bubble is not permitted to attend school because they, or another member of their bubble, have tested positive for Covid-19.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">OR</p> <p>We enter another 'lockdown' with total school closure.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Live lessons which will look different depending on the age of the children. This may be guided reading sessions, maths sessions or writing sessions delivered by the class teacher*. The frequency of when your child's sessions will occur will be communicated by your child's class teacher via Microsoft Teams. • Maths lessons uploaded to Microsoft Teams, following on/mirroring the maths being covered in the classroom at that time. The screens shared in the classroom and resources/worksheets used in the classroom will be shared on Microsoft Teams and answers will be provided for self-marking. • English lessons uploaded to Microsoft Teams following the sequence of learning happening in the classroom. The quantity will be dependent on age/stage of your child. This will include spelling, grammar and writing. Each week your child will be set an assignment to complete with a hand-in date. • Guided Reading uploaded to Microsoft Teams following the sequence of learning in the classroom. This will include some activities and the text which is the focus for the week. • Curriculum task(s) will be uploaded to Microsoft Teams for children to complete and hand in virtually. This will be lessons your child would have had in class this term which can be most easily adapted to remote learning. • 1:1 support if your child receives 1:1 support and they are isolating, a more bespoke programme of support will be set up. This may include phone calls / contact through Seesaw with your child's 1:1 support / Class Teacher.
